THE ASCENSION OF JESUS



In the season of Eastertide, we celebrate a mystery—the mystery that Jesus died, and that God made him alive again. We celebrate this happy news on Ascension Day. Read the story of Ascension Day from your Bible. It can be found in Luke 24:44-53 and in Acts 1:1- 11.

Christ’s ascension is a pretty big deal. Saint Luke includes a detailed accounts of Jesus’ instruction, blessing, and supernatural departure in both the ending of his “first book” (Luke 24:44-53) and the beginning of his “second book” (Acts 1:1-11). In the Reformed tradition we stress the importance of Christ’s ascension as a *witness* and *guarantee* of our own resurrection as well as a call to evangelism, justice, and compassion

On Ascension Day, the church celebrates Christ’s going up and returning to his Father in glory after his resurrection. Ten days later, we celebrate God coming down again, this time not in human form in a particular time and place but now as Spirit, a gift to each believer in every time and place. As we share in communion, we affirm Christ’s ascension by saying these words: ***Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.***
