# **THE DAY OF PENTECOST**

**Dates:** Pentecost is celebrated on a Sunday 50 days after Easter (counting Easter Sunday), or seven weeks (seven times seven) not counting Easter Sunday.

### **Meaning of Name**

Pentecost comes from the Greek word *pentēkostē* meaning "50th" (day). Pentecost is a reference to the Jewish festival Shavuot or the Festival of Weeks, which is held on the 50th day after the second day of Passover.

The celebration of Pentecost is recorded in the 2<sup>nd</sup> chapter of the Acts of the Apostles. When many people were gathered in Jerusalem for the traditional Jewish festival of 'Shavuot,' some astonishing things happened

that brought new meaning to the long-practiced tradition. While God's people were celebrating the giving of the religious law to Moses, the Holy Spirit descended on them. This event, which we celebrate as Pentecost, is known as the birth of the Christian church.

The foundation of the Church is built on the Spirit who empowers us. Pentecost is about receiving power from God to do things we could never do on our own. At Pentecost, we are reminded that the church was founded on the bedrock of reconciliation – the reconciliation of God to humanity and the reconciliation of each of us to one another. When God's people are together, we find unity in our diversity through the power of the Holy Spirit.

#### **Liturgical Colour: Red**

Red is a primary colour and a warm colour. It symbolizes fire, spirit, energy, passion, strength, power, intensity, courage, and determination. It draws to mind the flames dancing over the disciples and friends of Jesus gathered in the upper room on the day of Pentecost.

### A Prayer for the Day of Pentecost

Almighty God,

you poured out your Spirit to guide your disciples,

to bless your people with a variety of gifts,

and to empower your church to continue your Son's ministry.

We often resist the Spirit's guidance.

We are uncomfortable with the challenges the Spirit offers us.

We have ignored or belittled the gifts of others

and failed to live in ways that reveal Christ's love for the world.

God of compassion, forgive us.

Transform our lives by the power of your Spirit,

and renew our faithfulness to follow Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
