### Sermon Focus: Jeremiah 18:1-11

Jeremiah's visit to the potter's house is a favorite scripture passage of artists, and not just clay artists. This is one of the few times when the visual arts play a major role in a scripture passage. This story, recorded in Jeremiah 18:1-11, is the reading from Hebrew scripture on this 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost. The point of the visit is to give a (literally) hands on demonstration of how the nation of Israel - the clay - is in the hand of and ultimately at the mercy of the potter (God).

Jeremiah 18 provides a very distinct view as to who we are in God's hands: **Our identity is shaped by God.** This shaping by God applies not only to individuals but also to nations. God says, "At one moment I may declare concerning a nation or a kingdom, that I will pluck up and break down and destroy it, but if that nation, concerning which I have spoken, turns from its evil, I will change my mind about the disaster that I intended to bring on it."

As clay, rather than trying to shape ourselves, the Bible invites us to pursue a relationship with our Potter. The hard truth is that God is going to shape us whether we like it or not. "Now, therefore, therefore, say to the people of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem: Thus, says the LORD: Look, I am a potter shaping evil against you and devising a plan against you. Turn now, all of you from your evil way, and amend your ways and your doings."

The good news is that God offers us the chance to turn back to him before he reshapes us. Amen.
