We're At Advent

Advent is the beginning of the church year for most churches in the Western tradition. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is sometimes the last Sunday in November, and ends on Christmas Eve at sundown. Sometimes the fourth Sunday of Advent is Christmas Eve.

Meaning of Name:

The term Advent comes via Old English from the Latin adventus ("arrival"). It is a combination of ad (to) + venire (come). In Advent, we are anticipating the arrival of the baby Jesus ushering in hope, joy, peace and love for all people.

The season of Advent is a highlight of any congregation's life. It is a time of joy, color, light, and anticipation. And it is a time of worship. This is a season that calls us to fall to our knees in worship of the awesome God. Advent is the season where we remember that God chose to put on flesh and dwell among us. God reached down from incomprehensible heights to touch the life we live.

The second Sunday in Advent often has a focus on Peace. Our peace is found in God and in his Son, Jesus Christ. John the Baptist and all the prophets remind us – that to receive peace we must be prepared for it. We light the candle of peace today to remind us that Christ is the Prince of Peace – he is the one promised from the beginning of the world. We thank God for the hope he gives us and for the peace he bestows.
