- * Reach out to the less fortunate



At the end of this year, we will bid a hearty farewell to the venerable Wilfred "Wilf" Hallet as Treasurer of St. Mark's. This marks the end of 26 years of dedicated and meritorious service to the St. Mark's congregation, 15 of which he spent as Treasurer. Wilf as we affectionately call him at St. Mark's, his wife Donna and his daughter Kim have been long standing members of St. Mark's and have given their time, talent, and gifts to our church family unstintingly. Their presence and service at St. Mark's have added to the loving and welcoming presence of our church which continues to reach out to families within Malton and beyond.

Wilf began serving St. Mark's in 1995 auditing the church's books along with Doug Thomas. In 1998 he became a member of the Board of Managers and very shortly after in the year 2000 he became part of the team that counted and recorded the offering and collections after worship and other events. In 2005 our congregation needed a new treasurer as the then treasurer Fred Duggleby moved away from Malton. With a sense of purpose and a great human spirit Wilf stepped up and offered himself for service in this area of our church, this after being Assistant Treasurer since 2004. Right away he exemplified and applied himself with dignity. From the onset he managed the financial affairs of St. Mark's capably, with profound



competence and with integrity. The task of Treasurer is never an easy one and is also one that requires a level of commitment that is beyond ordinary. It also requires that one goes beyond the call of duty to ensure that our congregation remains financially compliant and viable as we engage with different economic changes from year to year. All in all, the job as Treasurer is not an easy one and one that requires true dedication and a sense of call.

For 16 years Wilf, gave many hours, his accounting skills, and personal resources to this task and he did so while responding to the many changes that came along the way. His watchfulness kept St. Mark's afloat not only financially but also helped us live up to the fiscal responsibilities and expectations set by the Government, the Presbytery, and the Presbyterian Church in Canada. Over the years Wilf has ensured that the financial obligations of St. Mark's were met in a timely manner and this through several trips from his home to St. Mark's weekly. The yearly financial statements were always ready in time for the Annual General Meetings. There were the monthly and quarterly updates that were always requested, and Wilf would never fall short. His financial prudence and accountability were of very high standards and Wilf's will be a hard act to follow.

As a congregation we have been tremendously blessed to have Wilf serve us as Treasurer and we take this opportunity to say a BIG THANK YOU for his work among us. God's Family of Faith Worshiping and Witnessing Together

Let the Church be the Church, Let the People rejoice. Oh, we've settled the question, We've made our choice. Let the anthems ring out, Songs of victory swell For the Church triumphant is alive and well.

When the global pandemic was declared in March 2020 little did we know that the life of the church would be changed in such a drastic way. The church has always grappled with change and some changes have impacted us negatively and other positively. Whatever way we look at it, the changes in the way the church carries out its worship and witness has had a dramatic impact on every member of our church. That being said; we have found ways to continue to share the Gospel of redeeming grace and lives have continued to be impacted through the ministry of our church.

Since March 2020 we have been worshiping online through YouTube and Zoom and although at times this has been a challenge it has given us a rewarding feeling for the most part. The rewarding feeling comes when we see the ways we have been able to connect as a church family despite the successive lockdowns and stay at home orders. The reward comes as we have sat down and folded our hands in resignation but have used the technological means available to worship and fellowship and keep the work of the church alive. God has been so good to us and have helped us not only stay together but has provided for our church so that we could acquire the tools needed to carry worship online and in person all at once.

When places of worship were allowed to reopen in September 2020, we adopted a hybrid model of worship. At that time a significant portion of our members were not yet ready to leave their homes. Each Sunday we had about 30 members in person at church and another 40 or so person online. It became apparent to us that this new paradigm for the church was here to stay so we began making plans to acquire the equipment needed to help us carry worship to people gathering in person as well as online. Through loving financial donations from our church family, we were able to acquire equipment to outfit our sanctuary so we can worship freely online as well as in person. We got quotations from 5 companies and in the end chose Century Audio Visual who gave us a reasonable quote and came well recommended by other churches. The wait was long for this work to be done as a worldwide shortage of key technological possibilities that the ministry of our church hold.






software caused a delay of almost 3 months for the work to begin.

On Wednesday, November 17th a team from Century Audio Visual began the final installation of technological equipment that will help us effectively offer a hybrid form of worship to our church family. The new pieces include a new sound system comprising of a state-of-the-art sound rack, a new computerized mixing board, new choir and pulpit microphones and a video switcher for live streaming. The new setup also included a new mounted camera that can be controlled virtually and a high-definition television screen that will accompany the already installed projection system. The enter project from cabling to installation took three days to complete. As part of this work, we also were blessed to have some new electrical upgrades added to our sanctuary. This part of the work was donated by Ridgewood Electric owned and operated by Iain MacFarlane whose parents were long standing members of St. Mark's and who himself grew up at St. Mark's as a youth.

I want to extend sincere thanks to you all for the prayerful support of this project. I also want to thank those of you who donated financially toward these much-needed upgrades to our sanctuary. Thank you to the Technology committee and especially to Lionel Jodha who was there every day to oversee this final phase of the project; to Isaac Asumadu Sakyi who oversaw the first phase of installing the PowerPoint technology and Sam Alfred who gave physical and prayerful support as well. Thank you to Century Audio Visual who have committed to helping us learn how to properly use this new system as we try our best to get it functional for worship on a weekly basis. We give God thanks for all the

As we answer the call to follow Jesus, we are in a great way giving ourselves for service and making ourselves available to be use by God in the places of need around us. We all remember Jesus's famous discussion with his Disciples in Matthew 25:35-40

³⁵ For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, ³⁶ I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.¹³⁷ "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? ³⁸ When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? ³⁹ When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' ⁴⁰ "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

As church families and faith communities rise to the occasions of need in their communities, they are challenged by this conversation in Matthew's gospel. This was our challenge over a year ago when we started to feed the hungry and reach out to those in need through our unnamed Ministry which later became St. Mark's Helpers. In the summer of 2020, we began receiving calls from individuals who were finding it hard to get by as the food banks they depended on intermittently struggled to keep afloat due to the sudden changes brought on by the pandemic. Through the generosity of our church family and a large food donation from Burnbrae Farms we were able to help over 20 families since the summer of 2020.

At the end of last year, we distributed Christmas hampers to some families here in Malton. These





hampers included items for Christmas dinner and other items of food and toiletries which were a great help to families in their time of need. A large number of the families we helped last year are still being helped on a monthly basis as the reports have shown that more and more people are turning to food banks for support. With the price of food and other grocery items skyrocketing many families have had to depend on the generosity of food banks and aid agencies in order to survive on a monthly basis.

The St. Mark's church family hears Matthew 25:35-40 clearly and also have heard Matthew 10:8, "freely you have received so freely give." Our entire church family has heard these calls of the gospel as each month different individuals rise to the occasion and donate items of food, clothes or gift cards to help other families who are struggling.

This year we are taking it a step further as we continue to reach out to others in our community and its environs. St. Mark's Helpers has delivered Christmas Hampers to 7 families and individuals in our community. The hampers include, non-perishable food items, gift cards, items of clothing, personal effects like purses, toiletries and toys for the families who have children. These families will be able to spend Christmas without worrying where their meals will come from. They will also experience what Jesus describes in Matthew 25 and their hope for the future will be rekindled.

This would not have been possible without your kindness and loving response to the call of Jesus to be His hands and feet in the world. This is part of what makes our church family special. From the over \$ 400 in gift cards to the numerous drop offs of groceries, toiletries, and clothing, you have been a tremendous blessing.
