On Sunday February 28, 2022, we kicked off our year of Anniversary celebrations with a grand opening service. It was truly a blessing to see members of our church family gather for worship and praise as we launched our year of celebrations with prayer, reflection on God's Word and a look at how it all started. Close to 60 people gathered in our sanctuary at St. Mark's and with the hybrid worship model we also had 38 participants on zoom and 25 on YouTube. This worship service was guided by the theme for the year of celebrations:

The 50th anniversary committee chose to invite past ministers who served St. Mark's or their surviving family members to be guest preachers for all the major 50th anniversary services. Rev. 



Ordination of New Elders:

50TH ANNIVERSARY MEMORIAL SERVICE

Over the past 50 years, St. Mark's has been home to many families, who have found a sense of home, comfort and welcome in this warm and friendly congregation. As St. Mark's grew and flourished over the years, there are countless individuals who gave their time, talent, and treasures to the ministry of St. Marks as we served our community in different ways. Many of these individuals were faithful, dedicated, and hardworking members of St. Mark's but have passed on and are now with the Lord in Glory. On Sunday May 22, 2022, at 11:00 am, we gathered in our 50th Anniversary Memorial Service where we paused to remember all our members who have passed on since our congregation started. Although we have had memorial services over the years it was the first memorial service where we were remembering all the members of St. Mark's who have died in the 50 years of our congregation's ministry. We were blessed to have Rev. Harry Bradley share the message with us in our memorial service. Rev Bradley served at St. Mark's for 5 years and fondly remembers many of those who we gathered to remember as well as many others who are still alive and remain part of our church family. In his message titled, "Crossing the Jordan Again" he encouraged us to remember the sacrifice of those who have gone before us even as we thank God for all we have been brought through and how much we have learnt from them.

A very significant part of the 50th anniversary memorial service was the unveiling of the memorial board which bears the names of all those who have been part of our church family and are now with the Lord. The Memorial board was donated by the family of Agnes Narayan who dedicated the board to her memory as she passed on in 2020. As we unveiled the memorial Board, members of the sub committee on history called the names of all those we gathered to memorialize. As we remembered them, we lit candles in their honour; the youth and senior choirs blessed our hearts in song and other family members shared in



prayers and the reading of scripture.

Another notable part of this service was pausing to render tributes for Basil Dilworth, Hazel Humeniuk and Lesley Irvine. All three were beloved members who we were not able to have services as the pandemic and other conditions did not allow. We remember them all with fondness and love. We continue to hold them in our hearts as they continue to rest in the arms of their Lord and Saviour. The Epistle to the Hebrews urges us: "since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith." (Hebrews 12:1-2).

May their souls rest in peace and light perpetual shine upon them.

Little Children.....Bright Gems for God's Crown

Since the start of the year, we have welcomed four infants to our church family and we give God thanks as we continue to pray for their growth and development and their walk with God.

On January 23rd we Pronounced blessings upon Kaicoya Zachary Mullings, and this was the first time we were dedicating a child virtually. Kaicoya and his family resides in Miramar Florida and were able to join us via Zoom for the entire duration of the service. On April 24th we welcomed Ali Elijah Redhead to our church family through the sacrament of baptism. Ali Elijah's parents Venisha Williams and Bernard Redhead grew up in Malton and have attended worship at St. Mark's on several occasions.

As we worshipped on May 15th it was our honour and privilege to welcome **Ayden Saint Quinn Ellis** to the St. Mark's church family through the sacrament of baptism. Ayden is the son of Nisa and Wayne Ellis who are regular attendees to worship at St. Mark's. Our Sister Lurline Jones is the proud Grandmother to Ayden.



There are many families who come from other countries where the reformed church sacraments mean so much to their lives. harles and Justina Martin gave birth to their son **Cyju Joshua Martin** in India on June 3rd, 2020. They returned to Canada shortly after his 1st birthday and as he celebrated his 2nd birthday, they dedicated him to the Lord at St. Mark's during our worship service.

In this 50th year of our congregation's life and witness we welcome Kaicoya Zachary, Ali Elijah, Ayden Saint Quinn and Cyju Joshua to the St. Mark's church family. We pray that they will continue to grow in God's nurture and love and one day share in the ministry of God's church.







REACHING ACROSS THE WORLD WITH STORIES OF JESUS

Every week since the pandemic started, we have been preparing and sharing weekly Sunday School activities with the children and families of St. Mark's. These simple activities are meant to keep our children thinking about how much Jesus loves them even as so many things change in our society. 50[™] ANNIVERSARY PORTUGUESE SUPPER

The fundraising ventures of our church have long been part of our congregation's way of extending hospitality to our community while raising funds to carry out the mission of the church. For many years the Portuguese Supper has been one of the fundraisers that has not only brought people together but has provided funds that has made several capital projects possible at St. Mark's. For the past two years we have not been able to host fundraising activities due to changes caused by the coronavirus pandemic. This year we ventured into new pathways opened by the pandemic as we hosted for the first time a "drive by and pick up" Portuguese Supper. Under the leadership of Gita Singh and her team, we were treated to a sumptuous meal of Portuguese chicken, Baby potatoes, Rice, Vegetables,



Chicken sauce, Bread, and Custard tart for dessert, all for only \$25. On May 28th several patrons dropped by between the hours of 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm to pick up their meals. Along with the many people who bought tickets and drove by to pick up their meals, there were several meals delivered to the indigent and elderly in our community. We thank God for the kindness of members of our church community who paid for these meals and donated the tickets to St. Mark's Helpers. St Mark's has been blessed to have Gita Singh and her family organizing this fundraiser over the years. Through their hard work and the generous support of our church family the Portuguese Supper raised \$3,815.00. Proceeds from the Portuguese Dinner will go towards the building fund of our church. We extend sincere thanks to Gita Singh and her entire team for their hard work and dedication in this area of our church. Job well done!

Being the hands and feet of Jesus St. Mark's Helpers Mid - Year Report

Writing this was a challenge for me. I'm sure it would bring some

sort of a smile or laugh to those who know me when I say that I was at a complete loss for words. Well, perhaps not a complete loss: desperate. I could not get the word desperate out of my head. The desperate needs of the families (friends) supported by The St. Mark's Family. The desperate need I have to communicate to my St. Mark's Family how by and through God's Grace and Love He is using us to help meet the needs: by His continuous and perfect Will. At the present time, The Helpers has been led to now assist 5 sets and varieties of families on a regular monthly basis. They each receive approximately 10 days of non-perishable food, a gift card for a local grocery store, and hygiene supplies.

Some examples of the families we support:

·A Grandmother supporting her 4 grandchildren (aged 6-14) after their parents suddenly died.

·A permanently disabled man who was being helped by his sister until she lost her job due to the COVID pandemic

An international student and his roommate who are both struggling to cope with bills and pay rent even as they can only work 22 hours for the month based on the stipulations of their student visas.







·An elderly man and his wife who both live on very little and have depended on food banks for survival for many years.

These parcels are delivered/picked up toward the end of the month once our friends are contacted. By having regular parcels coming in as money is running out, our friends are not left in the horrendous position to make the decision between paying rent or buying food.


The Helpers continues to be a Ministry led by Rev Germaine who also discerns providing for other friends who may be in need of assistance in urgent and/or a spontaneous temporary basis. This desperate need of mine is not just to share how all our St. Mark's Church family is so generously giving through the donations of food/hygiene products, gift cards, and monetary gifts. (Although that is part of it!) But I desperately need to let you know how our Gracious, Loving Father God has been taking each of these gifts (be it one can of chickpeas or \$100 bill) and making all of it "...work together for His good". So continuously and perfectly, we always end up with what is needed: each time, every time, all of the time.

There is nothing **desperate** about that.


